History of AAPFCO

- First fertilizer control law in US enacted by Massachusetts in 1869
- Fertilizers regulated in all but one of the 48 states by 1947
- Very limited in scope and lacked uniformity
- AOAC initiated first attempts at uniformity
- Association of American Fertilizer Control
 Officials organized out of AOAC in 1946
- Became AAPFCO in 1965



AAPFCO Purpose

The association's purpose is to provide a forum through which members may unite to:

- promote uniformity in laws and regulations;
- adopt effective analytical methods for fertilizer;
- develop high standards of fertilizer inspection techniques and procedures;
- promote adequate labeling and safe use of fertilizers;



AAPFCO Purpose, cont'd.

- provide facilities and opportunities for the free exchange of information and problem solving;
- cooperate with members of industry to promote the usefulness and effectiveness of fertilizer products and the protection of soil and water resources.



AAPFCO Motto

"Uniformity by Consensus"



So What? How does AAPFCO benefit you?

- Opportunity for industry input in developing model regulations for potential use by states
- Industry has a seat at the table and the opportunity for active involvement in establishing direction for regulatory programs throughout North America
- Aid in navigating the seas of individual state regulations – no federal regulation of fertilizers

- New "Essential Nutrients"
 - Labeling and Definitions Committee
 - Working on MOU with the Tri-Societies
- SRMs or CMPAF in fertilizers
 - New FDA Rule
 - Canadian Rule
 - Environmental Affairs Committee



Current Issues, cont'd.

- Analytical Methods Development and Validation
 - Methods Forum
 - Proposed structure for sponsoring high priority methods
- Federal ammonium nitrate regulations
 - Advanced Notice of Proposed Rulemaking
 - Public comment period



Current Issues, cont'd.

- Support for Nutrient Management BMPs
 - Right product
 - Right place
 - Right time
 - Right rate
- Preemption of local ordinances
 - Encouraging states to adopt
- Labeling of organic inputs
 - Need for clarification
